There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, "Render a just decision for me against my adversary." For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, "While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me."

(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 18:1-8)



"The Hound of Heaven" by Francis Thompson is a literary and a theological poem which you may have read in high school or college literature. The opening verse in one of the great classics of literature:

*I fled Him down the nights and down the days;
I fled him, down the arches of the years
I fled him down the labyrinthine ways
I hid in laughter and the mist of tears.*

The poet then continues to describe how he had fled from God, yet God continued to pursue him. Finally, the fugitive surrenders to God. And God, in another memorable verse of great literature, explains the folly of fleeing from him, "All things betray thee, who betrayest Me."

Thompson's poem resonates with the parable in today's gospel. There are two characters in this parable, the judge and the widow. Most people instinctively assume that the judge represents God and the widow is a desperate Christian asking God for help. But such a heartless judge is an unsatisfying image of God.

Therefore some scholars interpret the parable with those roles reversed. The judge represents an errant Christian; and the widow is an image of God. Just as the widow hounded the judge until he granted her justice, God pursues the errant soul until justification is realized. The widow is the gospel's Hound of Heaven.

Today's gospel parable, as The Hound of Heaven, is an image of how God offers salvation to an unbeliever. But how does this parable or the Hound of Heaven apply to me? I believe in God. I go to Church. I try to live by the commandments. I am trying to find God. Why would God be pursuing me?

Despite our general commitment and our basic good will, most of us have certain areas of our faith where we are fleeing from God. And the Hound of Heaven will pursue us until we have accepted him fully.

We are all tempted to customize Christianity to suit ourselves, to pick and choose what is to our liking. We may, for example, follow quite faithfully the moral code of personal conduct but turn a deaf ear to social justice and compassionate charity. Or we may focus on love, tolerance, and forgiveness but turn a deaf ear to the moral demands of the gospel.

We often rejoice that God is portrayed in Scripture as a God of love, mercy, and forgiveness. We should not forget that He is also a stubborn God and a nagging God. Every parent knows that there is such a thing as "holy nagging." Children need a constant, unyielding insistence to do what is right. God, Our Father, will continue his "holy nagging" until his children respond to his grace. In the words of this gospel, "because this widow keeps bothering me, I shall deliver a just decision for her." In the words of the Hound of Heaven, "I am He whom thou seek! You drove love from yourself, you who drove it from me."

Domestic violence affects the whole family, including any children. Faith communities are called to offer hope, help, and healing to all harmed by domestic abuse and violence.

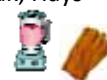
