World Mission Sunday

Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted.



(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 18:9-14)



Football fans know that the NFL and College football have penalties for excessive celebrations after a touchdown. The NCAA rule reads: "Any delayed, excessive, prolonged or choreographed act by which a player attempts to focus attention upon himself is subject to a 15 yard penalty." Athletes who strut around like peacocks when they make a good play often try to justify their boasting, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." But the NCAA replies that such actions are "flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct" because "the game is about the team, not the individual." When we were kids refereeing our own games our unwritten rule book said of such braggarts, "Self-praise stinks!" That may express the way many feel about the Pharisee in today's gospel. "Self-praise stinks!"

There is something contemptible about the Pharisee in this gospel, and something comforting about the tax collector. But the gospel contrast of the two is not simplistic. The Pharisees were the most observant of all the Jews. The Pharisee probably did as he boasted. He was saying, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." He fasted from all food and all drink two days of every week. He gave ten percent of his income to the temple. Few Catholics do half as well observing their faith.

The tax collectors, by contrast, were collaborators with the occupying and oppressive Roman government. They over-taxed the working people and kept the excess amount for themselves. The tax collector was a professional thief, a white collar crook. Today such financial embezzlers go to prison — if they get caught.

The Pharisee was a hard-working, church-going, pillar of the community. The tax collector was a thief, a thug, and a cheat. Yet in this parable, the tax collector is the good guy and the Pharisee is the bad guy. What are we to make of this?

This story does not condemn the Pharisee for being religious. It condemns him for being self-righteous. Not for making the touchdown, but his manner of boasting about it. The parable does not praise the tax collector for cheating. It praises his contrition. The Pharisee trusted in himself. The tax collector trusted in God.

This is reflected in their prayers. The Pharisee prayed to himself. The tax collector prayed to God. The purpose of the Pharisee's prayer was not to praise God, but to congratulate himself. He asks nothing from God, because he needs nothing from God. He is his own salvation. The tax collector's simple plea for mercy focuses on God. He admits that he is a sinner and knows that he cannot save himself. Only God can do that.

There was good and bad in both the Pharisee and the tax collector. The challenge is to discern the good from the bad, and to evaluate them. When Saint Francis saw a lost soul, a flagrant sinner, an arrogant criminal, he would say, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." St. Francis knew that the goodness in his life was from God, and that his sins were his own.

Modern football stars who preen themselves after a touchdown may say, "If you can do it, it ain't bragging." But the Gospel says, "If you can do it, praise God." Because self-praise stinks.

Patron Saint of the Internet: St. Isidore of Seville

In 1997, Pope Paul II declared Isidore of Seville the patron saint of the Internet. Saint Isidore died long before the first host-to-host ARPANET connection in 1969.

Saint Isidore wrote a 20-book opus, *Etymologies*, also known as the *Origins*, in which he tried to record everything that was known. Published after his death in the year 636, it was for a thousand years considered the encyclopedia of all human knowledge. Written in simple Latin, it was all a man needed in order to have access to everything he wanted to know about the world but never dared to ask. It was a tool for those seeking wisdom much like the INTERNET is used now.


