The Events of Holy Week till the Ascension

The gospel chronologies of Holy Week have some minor variations. While the other gospels have the Last Supper on Passover, John's gospel prefers a theological to a chronological order and has the Last Supper before Passover so that The Lamb of God dies on the cross as the lambs for Passover are slain in the temple. There are also variations in the sequence of the trials before the Sanhedrin and Pilate, yet there is a general agreement on most events as follows:

Palm Sunday—Jesus enters Jerusalem triumphantly and returns to Bethany that evening.

Monday—Jesus cleanses the temple and curses the fig tree, leaving the city in the evening to return again to Bethany.

Tuesday—The fig tree has withered. Jesus offers the parables of the two sons, the wicked vinedresser, the wedding feast, and the seven brothers. He teaches in Jerusalem on controversial issues such as: taxes to Caesar, the source of his authority, the nature of John's Baptism, the greatest commandment, the title Son of David, the deceit of the Scribes, and the temple's destruction.

Spy Wednesday—The religious leaders plot against Jesus and Judas agrees to betray him for thirty pieces of silver. Jesus is anointed by a woman at Simon's house in Bethany. (Mt 26:6; Mk 14:3, and earlier in Jn 12:1) This anointing is a different event from that by a "sinful woman" in Luke's gospel. (Lk 7:47)

Holy Thursday—After the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, Jesus and the disciples go to Gethsemane where he is arrested and taken to Annas, and then to the high priest Caiaphas for a trial before the Sanhedrin. Peter denies him, as predicted.

Good Friday—Judas returns the silver to the chief priests. The Sanhedrin hands Jesus over to Pilate to be tried for sedition. When Pilate offers a choice, the crowd chooses Barabbas over Jesus, yet Barabbas, meaning "son of Abba," may offer a deeper message. After having Christ flogged and crowned with thorns Pilate presents him to the crowd as their King. But the crowd demands crucifixion and Pilate accedes. Jesus carries his cross to Calvary, is crucified between two criminals, entrusting his mother to John. Joseph of Aramathea asks Pilate for his body which is buried before sunset.

Holy Saturday—The Jewish Sabbath. Guards are set at the tomb. Women prepare spices and oils to bring to the tomb on Sunday.

Easter Sunday—The women find the tomb empty and report this to the disciples. Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene, to the other women, to two disciples on the way to Emmaus, to Peter, and to the disciples in the upper room with Thomas absent.

A week later, Jesus appeared to the eleven disciples in the Upper Room with Thomas present. Later he appeared to the disciples fishing in the Sea of Galilee, to James the brother of Jesus and to more than 500. Forty days after the Resurrection he appeared to his disciples on the Mount of Olives from which he ascended to heaven.


