And so I say to you, you are Peter, upon this rock I will build





"You are Peter and on this rock I will build my church," is facetiously referred to as *the* Catholic verse because Catholics revere the bishop of Rome as the successor of Peter while most other Christians do not.

St. Peter's original name was Simon. Christ gave him a new name, a nickname. In Scripture God changed the names of key people to signify their new purpose: Abraham, Sarah, Jacob, Moses, and Paul. Christ gave Simon the Aramaic name *Cephas* which means rock. "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my church," is a play on words, a pun. Literally it reads, "You are a rock and on this rock I will build my church."

The word *church* appears only twice in the gospels, both times in Matthew. In these two instances, *church* does not mean a building, but the assembly of God's people, the community of believers. Belonging to a church is not belonging to a building, but to the community of those who share the same faith. Yet a church building is important as the community's place of worship, the house of God in their midst.

Some say that the rock referred to by Christ is not Peter but his faith in Christ and that his church was built on the faith of Peter. Our Catholic tradition holds that the person of Peter is the rock on whom Christ built his church. You cannot separate a faith from the person who expresses that faith as you cannot separate the love in a marriage from the couple who share that love. Faith is never an abstract faith. It is a faith living in a person as a unique human expression of that faith. Peter, embodying a unique faith in Christ, is the rock on whom the church is built.

The church today under Pope Francis is same church as the church of Pope Benedict XVI, Pope John Paul, or Pope Pius XII, or Pope Leo the Great. Yet that same faith is expressed by each in a unique way. Although Peter was sincere, he was also imperfect. Peter proudly professed faith in Christ, yet Peter denied Christ. Peter rejoiced to be a disciple of Christ, yet he wept over his threefold denial. Peter ran to the tomb on Easter morning, yet he hesitated and sank into the sea.

Many wonder why Christ chose the impetuous, faltering Peter to be the foundation of his church. Other apostles were better examples of a more secure faith. John, the beloved disciple, never doubted, was loyal to the end, stood at the foot of the cross, and arrived at the tomb first on Easter. One might expect Christ to choose the most loyal, the most trustworthy apostle.

Yet Christ chose Peter. He also chose us. And we can identify with Peter's imperfect faith. We want to be better Christians than we actually are. In matters of faith we often resemble Peter, the rock. We can be as solid as a rock, but also as dense as a rock. We can be as sound as a rock, but also as stubborn as a rock. We can be as firm as a rock, but also as clumsy as a rock. Our faith has many of the flaws of Peter, the rock.

Although Peter struggled with his faith in Christ, perhaps precisely because he struggled with his faith, he was loyal to the end. He willingly accepted a martyr's death. In the crucial final test, Peter's faith was rock solid, as the Lord foretold, "You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church."


