

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."



In today's gospel of the Transfiguration we hear the voice of God the Father. Only three times in the gospels does God the Father speak: at the baptism of Christ by John the Baptist (Mt 3:13, Mk 1:9, Lk 3:21), at the

transfiguration of Christ on Mount Tabor (Mt 17:1, Mk 9:2, Lk 9:28), and during the prayer of Christ before his passion (Jn 12:28).

At the Baptism of the Lord in Matthew's gospel the Father says, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." In the gospels of Mark and Luke the Father addresses not the crowd but

Christ himself personally, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Those words reveal the intimate relationship within the Trinity of God the Father with Jesus his Son.

At the Transfiguration Matthew records, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." Mark has, "This is my beloved Son; listen to Him." Luke says, "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him." Matthew and Mark express the Father's pleasure in his Son while Luke describes Christ as "chosen."

The third time that God the Father speaks in the gospels is during the prayer of Christ before his passion: "'Father, glorify your name.'" Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it and will glorify it again.'" (Jn 12:28). This event in John's gospel is similar to the account of the agony in the Garden which is not recorded in John.

At the Baptism and the Transfiguration, God the Father states that Christ is his Son, beloved and chosen; that He is pleased with Him and his mission; and that we are to listen to Him. Jesus Christ is true God and true man; faith in Him offers salvation.

When God the Father speaks before the passion of Christ in the gospel of John, it is in the theological context of that gospel in which Jesus is fully



conscious of his divine pre-existence. He realizes that through death He is returning to the divine state which He has temporarily left during his stay in this world. His destiny, which the faithful will eventually share, is glory. "'Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it and will glorify it again." (Jn 12:28).

Most of the things we know about our Christian faith are from the deeds and words of Christ as conveyed by the tradition of the church. But on these three occasions we have the testimony, the very words, of God the Father. There is no higher authority.

The Safety Coordinator will oversee your training, answer any questions you may have and make sure your training is properly recorded.
