Monday is Presidents' Day when we pause to remember our great presidents, especially George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Both of these men were guided by a religious faith, not so much in the formal denominational sense, but in a conviction of conscience before God. That fact is often forgotten in our secular age which prefers to divorce religious faith from public life. Lest we forget their heritage of faith, here are a few quotations of these two great presidents regarding religious faith in the public square.

GOERGE WASHINGTON:

"Do not let any one claim to be a true American if they ever attempt to remove religion from politics." 9-7-1764

"Be assured that I entertain a proper sense of your fervent supplication to God for my temporal and eternal happiness. 8-8-1789

"The propitious smiles of heaven can never be expected on a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and right, which heaven itself has ordained." 4-30-1789

"I have often expressed that every man, conducting himself as a good citizen, and being accountable to God alone for his religious opinions, ought to be protected in worshipping the Deity according to the dictates of his own conscience." 8-8-1789

ABRAHAM LINCOLN:

"In regard to this great book, I have but to say, it is the best gift God has given to man. All the good Savior gave to the world was communicated through this book. But for it we could not know right from wrong. All things most desirable for man's welfare, here and hereafter, are found portrayed in it." 9-7-1864

"The gifts of God should be gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American people. I do, therefore, invite my fellow-citizens in every part of the United States to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November as a day of thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwells in the heavens." 10- 3-1863

"I have never denied the truth of the Scriptures and I have never spoken with intentional disrespect of religion in general, or of any denomination of Christians in particular. I do not think I could myself be brought to support a man for office whom I knew to be an open enemy of, or scoffer at, religion." 7-31-1846

"We have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand, which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us." 3-30-1863
