**Come after me, and I will make you

(from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 4:12-23)



Language scholars tell us that the fine art of a language is in the use of adverbs. It is easy to select bold nouns and action verbs and shiny adjectives. But the careful use of fitting adverbs separates the master of a language from the amateur.

That bears true in the gospels, where the careful use of adverbs carries subtle but inspiring messages. In today's gospel when Christ invited Peter and this brother Andrew to follow him and become fishers of men, the text says, "At *once* they left their nets and followed him." *At once*. And the gospel says further of the brothers James and John, "He called them, and *immediately* they left their boats and their father and followed him." *Immediately*.

While the term *immediately*, or *at once* (the Greek is Eutheos), is found often in each of the gospels, it is especially characteristic of the gospel of Mark. It is found seven times already in the first chapter of Mark's gospel:

- "At *once* coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened" (1:10).
- "*Immediately* the Spirit drove him into the wilderness" (1:12).
- "He saw James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, who also were in the ship mending their nets, and *immediately* he called them" (1:20).
- "They went into Capernaum and *immediately* on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught" (1: 21).
- "When they came out of the synagogue, they *immediately* entered into the house of Simon" (1:29).
- "Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever and they *immediately* told him about her" (1:30).
- "And warning the cured leper, he sent him away *at once*" (1:43).

Immediately (at once) is found no less than forty times in Mark's Gospel. It is used as a very intense expression to show the total commitment of Christ by the manner in which he served. There was no tardiness about Christ's ministry; he served *at once*. He was *immediately* about his Father's business. There was no delay, but he performed the work given him *at once*. This adverb tells of the willing, even eager promptness of his service and the urgency of his mission. There was no holding back, no reluctance, no slackness, but a willing *immediate* quality to his work.

This was true not only in the mission of Christ but also in the response of his early followers. In today's gospel Peter and Andrew "left their nets *at once* and followed him;" James and John, "*immediately* left their boats and their father and followed him."

There is a similar energy in the events of Easter morning when "Mary Magdalene *ran* to tell Peter and the others about the empty tomb . . . then Peter and the other disciple both *ran* to the tomb and the other disciple *outran* Peter." The late bishop Fulton Sheen said that if he ever saw anyone running to church he would know that the day of salvation has arrived. It may be symbolic of sluggish faith that we tarry on our way to church as a school boy burdened by his backpack trudges reluctantly to class. The eager willingness of Christ to serve and the energetic response of his early followers is a challenge for us modern Christians to live our faith with an energy that reflects a joyful commitment.
