“Something got lost in the translation.” That is a common lament when transposing a concept from one language into another, or simply retelling a good story.

“Something got lost in the translation” might also be true of the Beatitudes in today’s gospel. The beatitudes each begin with *Blessed*: Blessed are the poor in spirit; blessed are the meek; blessed are the peacemakers. What does it mean to be *blessed*? The dictionary offers many synonyms: saintly, holy, blissful, happy. Individually and together they convey a sense of divine favor, God’s benevolence, and good fortune.

However, the *blessed* of the Beatitudes is yet a deeper concept. St. Jerome’s Latin translation rendered the original Greek as *beati*. English versions then translated *beati* as *blessed*. Your high school Latin may be helpful here. *Blessed* is a correct translation of *beati*. Yet *beati* has a fuller meaning; it also means *holy* and *happy*. Those who live the Beatitudes are truly *blessed* in that they are also *holy* and *happy*. *Blessed* are the merciful; *Holy* are the merciful; *Happy* are the merciful. *Blessed* are the peacemakers; *Holy* are the peacemakers; *Happy* are the peacemakers.

The Beatitudes offer a vision where the peacemaker, the merciful, and the righteous are blessed and holy and happy in a unity of goodness which is the fullness of Christian life. Unfortunately, for many people holiness is the opposite of happiness, perhaps even the enemy of it. Happiness and holiness are competing forces, pulling in opposite directions. You can have one; but not both together. No surprise then that many people choose such a happiness, but soon realize they have neither happiness nor holiness. In truth, holiness and happiness form one indivisible unit.

While *blessed* and *holy* may readily be associated with living the beatitudes, it is the *happiness* that is easily overlooked. Some think that religious faith restricts freedom and limits the joy of life so that those who, in a delusion of freedom, ignoring the gospel ideals are the ones who are happy. We think of the great saints as holy and blessed, but we often fail to realize that they were also happy. Some are surprised when St. Francis, or St. Theresa, or Padre Pio is referred to as a “happy saint,” as though that were a paradox. The saints lived the Beatitudes; they were blessed, holy, and happy.

On World Youth Day Pope Francis told young people to “have the courage to be happy” and he offered the Beatitudes as a guide on the journey to happiness. This search for happiness, said the Pope, is shared by people of all times and all ages. “God has placed in the heart of every man and woman an irrepressible desire for happiness, for fulfillment,” he said. “In Christ,” continued the Holy Father, “you will find your every desire for goodness and happiness fulfilled. He alone can satisfy your deepest longings, which are so often clouded by deceptive worldly promises.”

“In a culture of relativism and the ephemeral, many preach the importance of ‘enjoying’ the moment. They say that it is not worth making a life-long commitment, making a definitive decision ‘forever.’ I am asking you to rebel against this culture that sees everything as temporary and that believes you are incapable of responsibility.”

Pope Francis finished his message by quoting the French novelist and convert Leon Bloy who said, “There is only one sadness in life; that of not being a saint.”

KANSAS DAY—156 YEARS OLD BECAME THE 34TH STATE ON JANUARY 29, 1861

The flag of Kansas was designed in 1925 and officially adopted by the Kansas State Legislature on March 23, 1927, and modified in 1961 (the word "Kansas" was added below the seal in gold block lettering). It was first flown at Fort Riley by Governor Benjamin S. Paulen in 1927 for the troops at Fort Riley and for the Kansas National Guard.

From 1925 to 1927, Kansas used a state banner instead of a flag. The Kansas state banner, which consisted of a large sunflower and the word "Kansas" on a blue field, was intended to be hung from a horizontal bar, rather than a vertical flag pole. It was given a unique design to avoid "competition" with the United States flag. However, after the banner was rejected for display in Washington, D.C., and generated complaints for its awkward method of hanging, the state legislature adopted a state flag that saw the addition of the word "Kansas" at the bottom in 1961 but has otherwise retained its original design.

FACTS ABOUT KANSAS

- Fort Riley was established near the Kansas River in 1853 to protect settlers and trade along the Oregon and Santa Fe Trails.
- When French astronomer Pierre Janssen first discovered the element he called helium on the sun in 1868, it was believed to be one of the most rare elements. It wasn't until 1905, when faculty members at The University of Kansas in Lawrence began experimenting with gas from a newly drilled well in Dexter, that helium was identified as a common element found on Earth.
- Kansas is the leading producer of wheat in the United States. Referred to as "The Wheat Capital of the World," Sumner County produced 9 million bushels in 2009.
- Meade's Ranch in Osborne County, Kansas, is the Geodetic Center of North America—the point of reference by which all property lines and boundaries in North America are surveyed. Identified in 1901, this triangulation station for the United States, Canada and Mexico is also known as the North American Datum. (*The Geographic Center of the 48 contiguous states is in Lebanon, Kansas, in Smith County.*)
- Although the origin remains unclear, the terms "jayhawk" and "jayhawker" were originally used to describe raiders and looters during the period of unrest following the Kansas-Nebraska Act of 1854 when settlers of the Kansas Territory were left to decide the issue of slavery. It was later used solely as a label for free-state proponents, and eventually became associated with all Kansans.
- During the Civil War, Kansas suffered the highest rate of fatal casualties of any Union state.



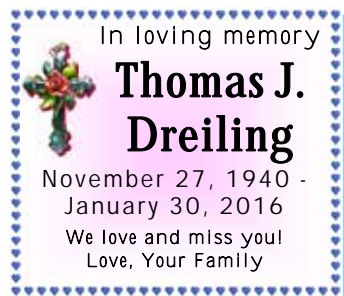
