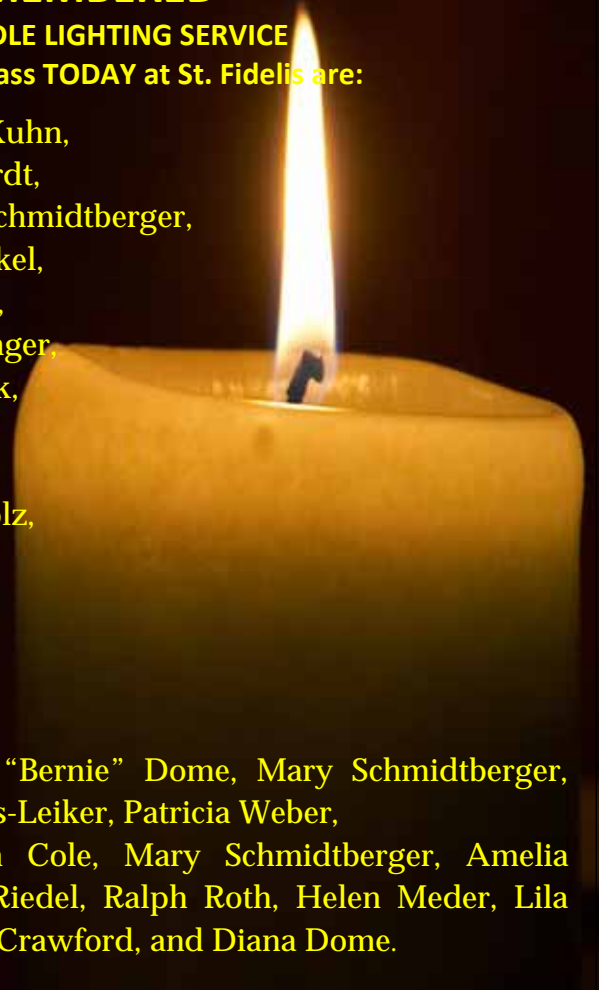

Stewardship. You have heard that term in church many times. Perhaps it is so often associated with fund raising that it can wear out its welcome. Today's gospel parable of the talents is the scriptural model for Christian stewardship, but the illustration is also financial with the possibility of again a cool reception.

A more constructive approach to our Christian duty to be stewards of God's gifts is to speak more comprehensively of the stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. Note the order, the priority. Not treasure, talent, and time. But time, talent, and treasure.

There is yet a better, but also more challenging, way to express our Christian stewardship: we are the stewards not the masters of God's creation. That includes nature and grace. It includes the flora and fauna of ecology, but especially our own body and soul. There is a very prevalent attitude in today's world that I am the master of my life and everything in my world. "I paid for it. It's mine." Such a self-centered disposition can be the root of many social ills.

When you say, "I am a Catholic," or "I am a Christian," or "I am a believer," you are in essence saying, "I am the steward and not the master of my life and everything in my life." When asked for a brief summary of Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment, *Laudato Si*, a noted scholar offered, "We are the stewards not the masters of nature."

In today's gospel parable stewardship is well rewarded. But don't misinterpret that reward. It is not receiving more free time, greater talents, or a richer treasure when we are generous with our time, talent, and treasure. The reward, rather, is that when we offer our time in service we understand better the purpose of our time, when we use our talents unselfishly we further develop those talents, and when we give of our treasure we learn the real value of material wealth.

We are reading this parable on the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day. If there is any defining characteristic of the steward versus the master it is gratitude. Stewardship is gratitude for gifts received. Stewardship is a generosity inspired by the generosity of God. Good stewards of God's gifts are givers of gifts, which is the joy of a Happy Thanksgiving.

family MATTERS — ADVENT

(The First Sunday of Advent is December 3, 2017. Time to prepare.)

What traditions will your FAMILY be doing this Advent?
Making an Advent Wreath, Jessie Tree, or Advent Calendar?
Maybe it is time to start a new tradition to prepare your FAMILY for Advent.

November 30 is the feast day of St. Andrew the Apostle. St. Andrew was the very first disciple called by Our Lord, and he is the one who got his brother, St. Peter, to become Jesus' disciple too. In keeping with his role as "the first", the feast of St. Andrew marks the beginning of a new liturgical year with the start of Advent. The Sunday that falls nearest to St. Andrew's feast day on November 30 is always the first Sunday of Advent.

The St. Andrew Christmas Novena is often called the "Christmas Novena" or the "Christmas Anticipation Prayer", because it is prayed 15 times a day from the Feast of Andrew the Apostle (November 30) until Christmas Eve. While the novena is tied to the Feast of St. Andrew, it is not actually addressed to St. Andrew, but to God himself, asking Him to grant our request in honor of the birth of His Son at Christmas.

You can say the prayer all 15 times at once, divide up the recitation as necessary: perhaps 5 times at each meal, before or after school, or at bedtime. The beauty and sweetness of this prayer will unfold for you through its daily recitation, allowing you to meditate more fully on the mystery of the Incarnation.

Prayed as a FAMILY, the St. Andrew Christmas Novena is a beautiful way to focus our attention on the Advent season, increase our awareness of the real focus of Christmas, and to prepare our families spiritually for His coming.



Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God! to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Saviour Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.
