

On this final Sunday of the liturgical year the gospel is about the final judgement. Along with the gospels of the past two Sundays, the parables of the ten bridesmaids and the talents, today's gospel is part of the discourse on the end times in Matthew. These three readings offer a unified message on the final coming of Christ the King.


We are now living between the Ascension of Christ and his final return. That is the context for the parable of the ten virgins awaiting the arrival of a bridegroom. The wise virgins had extra oil to provide lighted lamps until he arrived, but the foolish thought only of the present moment and ran out of oil. Their unlighted lamps were not ready for the arrival of the bridegroom, the final coming of Christ. The time of waiting for Jesus, the

bridegroom, is a period granted by God in his mercy and patience. As we wait we should not be lulled asleep by the distractions of daily life, but keep our faith alert through prayer and the sacraments.

In the parable of the talents Jesus warned against letting selfishness or fear prevent us from using the gifts God has given us. Those who hold within themselves all that the Lord has given them are not faithful stewards. Our God-given talents are not only for our own benefit but also for the good of others, and we must account for our use of them.

In the gospel image of the final judgment the sheep on the right are those who reflected God's love in their lives, while the goats on the left did

not. We will be judged on our charity to our brothers and sisters, especially the vulnerable and the needy. Generosity in such charity is not possible by our own powers alone, but only with the help of God's grace which always precedes and strengthens us. "Apart from me you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5)



The return of Christ as judge of the world is often far from our thoughts. We need to recall that Jesus often preached the reality of his final coming. Looking to the final judgment should not induce fear but move us to live better in the present moment. With patient mercy God offers us this time that we might learn to recognize him in the poor and the small, to be vigilant in prayer and unselfish in love, so that when he comes he will find us to be his good and faithful stewards.


