We all want to believe that we are good workers who earn our wages, are competent at our trade, show up on time and put in a full day's work. And that makes today's gospel of the workers in the vineyard a puzzling and a disturbing parable. It just doesn't seem fair. Management as well as unions might be troubled by this gospel.

Our frustration is misplaced. This gospel is a parable. A parable is a story or a metaphor drawn from nature or common life but which points to a reality that transcends these. It often leaves sufficient doubt about its precise application so as to tease the mind into active thought. It raises questions, unsettles the complacent, and challenges one to reflection and action. Parables should disturb us and this one certainly does that.

Today's parable about the workers in the vineyard is not about fair labor practices. It is about grace. Grace is a gift from God to which we have no right, a pure gift. Yet even this spiritual application may seem unfair. We expect God to be fair regarding salvation. Perhaps we fashion God too much in our own likeness. We think we know what God should do. But divine justice is not simply human justice purified. Scripture reminds us that the ways of God are not our ways. In fact, God's ways often defy human wisdom.



This parable is also about generosity. God is generous with his grace. As the owner of the vineyard asks, "Are you envious because I am generous?" If you serve God on the basis of rules and regulations, merit and reward, you will be troubled by this parable, and many others. God's grace is not determined by legality, but by largess. Without doing an injustice to those who serve him long and well, God reaches out to those who are faltering and failing. This parable teaches us that we do not work for God "by the hour," we work for God "by the heart." And each heart is known to God alone.



The personal application of this parable may be unsettling. We are the workers who began at a late hour. In some aspect of our spiritual life we have all arrived late. We may have been born and raised in the Catholic faith and regular at Sunday Mass. But we have come to a full appreciation of our faith late in life. In some aspect of our spiritual life — prayer or charity or forgiveness — we are the workers who began at the last hour.

We should rejoice in this parable about the generosity of God's mercy because in some manner we are all in need of it.

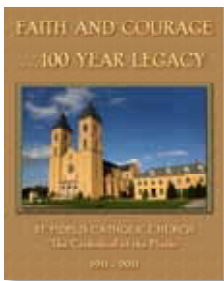
### Get Vitals Checked on Tuesdays
