

The kingdom of God
 is at hand. Repent,
 and believe in the gospel.

(from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 1:14-20)



If Jesus of Nazareth would return to earth today, what would he say? If he had a thirty-second commercial spot on primetime television what would be his message?

Many might answer that question with their favorite verse of scripture. Perhaps, "You shall love God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself." Good answer. Maybe, "Whatever you do to the least of my children you do to me." A very good answer. Or better yet, "Forgive your enemies." All good answers. But all wrong — according to scripture scholars.

The majority of scripture scholars think that if Jesus returned to earth he would repeat the key verse in today's gospel, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."

"Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand" has three concepts: *repent* — *kingdom of God* — *at hand*. *Repent* means much more than converting from a life of sin to a life of grace. It means continual growth in your faith commitment. Repent means conversion, and conversion is something that must happen everyday. You cannot live today with yesterday's faith.

"Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." *The kingdom of God* may be the most important and the most difficult concept in the gospels. It defies a complete definition. We know what it is not. It is not a geographical or social structure. The church is part of the kingdom of God but the church is not equivalent to the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God is wherever the power of God is acting in the world. The kingdom of God is what God wills the world to become. As we pray in the Lord's prayer, "Thy kingdom come."

"Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand." "*At hand*." Many view that as the threat of a deadline. Fire and brimstone. A proper understanding of "*at hand*" is crucial to the message of Christ. "*At hand*" is not a threat; it is a promise. It is not a deadline; it is an opportunity. The meaning of "*at hand*" is related to the recent feast of Christmas, to the incarnation. God has become one of us, he has shared our nature, he is near to us — *at hand*.

"*At hand*" is also translated well as "near," or "among you," or "within." All of which mean that grace is offered now, don't miss it. Grace is an opportunity. An old proverb says, "Opportunity knocks but once." "Repent . . . the kingdom of God . . . is at hand." You cannot live today with yesterday's faith.

Luther College Nordic Choir Performs Feb. 3 at St. Fidelis

Luther College Nordic Choir of Decorah, Iowa, one of the top college choirs in the nation, will perform at 7:30 p.m. **Saturday, February 3**, at the Basilica of St. Fidelis.

The performance by the 73-member Nordic Choir is open to the public. No admission will be charged, but a free-will offering will be taken to defray expenses of the tour.

The 2018 Nordic Choir tour program includes selections by Randall Thompson, Hans Leo Hassler, and others, including hymn-arrangements, spirituals, and the traditional Nordic Choir closing piece "O Lord God" by Pavel Chesnokov.

The concert is part of Nordic Choir's 2018 tour of the Midwest and Colorado. The choir tours annually and has performed around the world and throughout the United States. Nordic Choir enjoyed the tenure of Weston Noble as its conductor for 57 years. This tour marks the first year of the Nordic Choir under the baton of Dr. Andrew Last, Luther alumnus of 1997.

Luther is home to one of the largest collegiate music programs in the world with six choirs, three bands, three orchestras, two jazz bands, and numerous chamber ensembles, totaling more than 800 student musicians. Nearly 275 music majors study music theory/ear training, history, education, composition, church music, and performance.






