A Mother's Day Prayer

This year Mother's' Day falls on the Sunday that the church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord into heaven. Today's gospel from Mark describes the gifts endowed to those whom Christ commissioned to continue his work here on earth. Since this gospel passage is meant to be read allegorically it is fitting that the allegory be extended to the work of mothers.

"These signs will accompany those who believe:
in my name they will drive out demons,
they will speak new languages.
They will pick up serpents with their hands,
and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them.
They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover."

- "... they will drive out demons." From the terrible twos to the tempestuous teens, mothers have driven out rebellious demons. Had they not, more deadly demons would have overtaken you.
- "... they will speak new languages." From baby talk to teenage slang, mothers have learned to communicate with their children; and to distinguish an honest appeal from a deceptive ruse.
- "... they will pick up serpents with their hand." Imagine the "serpents" they had to pick up when they cleaned your room; not to mention the soiled linens of infants.
- ". . . and if they drink any deadly thing , it will not harm them." The tears mothers shed over wayward children could have been a deadly potion, but their motherly love was not harmed.
- ". . . they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." Mothers have spent many nights with a sick child; and devised remedies to cure headaches and heartaches, real and imagined.
- "... then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God." On this Mothers' Day we remember with honor and affection not only mothers still among us but also those deceased. Even in a natural sense they are with us now. We still hear their words of wise counsel. They are part of our conscience. And we know that God will reward them abundantly for the good they have instilled in their children.


