## The Way

There is a small detail in today's gospel that should not be missed. After the blind man received his sight the gospel adds that "He followed him on the way." When scripture speaks of *the Way* it is not talking about a path, a road, or travel directions. It is not a physical or geographical term, but the concept of the spiritual path of one's inner life. It is referring to a way of life, the Christian way of life.

When the blind man in this gospel is given his physical sight, he is also granted the vision of faith to follow the teachings of Christ, to follow him on *the Way*. The first Christians referred to the new manner of their life inspired by their faith in Christ as *the Way*.

The Acts of the Apostles mentions *the Way* four times. Saul went to Damascus to arrest those who "belonged to the Way." (Acts 9:2; 22:4) In Ephesus, Paul met some in the synagogue who "refused to believe and publicly maligned the Way." (Acts 19:9) During his trial before Felix, Paul said, "I admit that I worship the God of our ancestors as a follower of the Way." (Acts 24:14) We are also told that Felix knew about the Way. (Acts 24:22)

The early followers of Christ referred to themselves as followers of *the Way* because of these memorable words of Christ: "I am the way and the truth and the life." (Jn 14:6) Luke says that Aquila and Priscilla explained to Apollos "the way of God." (Acts 18:26) Peter refers to Christianity as "the way of truth." (2 Peter 2:2) And the writer of Hebrews says that Jesus is the "new and living way" for us to enter the Most Holy Place. (Heb 10:19-20)

"The Way" is also a delightfully challenging movie about pilgrims on Santiago de Compostela. The title of that film is taken from the many New Testament passages referring to the faith life of the early Christians as *the Way*.

A way of life refers to a pattern of habits formed by one's values. Christ invites us to his way of life. Today's gospel tells us that when the blind man received his physical sight and the vision of faith, "He followed him on the way." That is the goal of all faithful Christians: to follow Him on *the Way*.

## All Saints Day and All Souls Day History

In the first two days of November each year, the Church commemorates two linked feast days: All Saints (November 1) and All Souls (November 2). All Saints is easy to understand: We remember all those who have lived lives of heroic holiness, whether the Church has canonized them or not. On All Souls, we remember all those who have died, not just the spiritual superstars.

From the earliest days the church has prayed for the deceased. Their judgment is in the hands of God, and we trust in God's mercy. But we also believe that God cares about us and our concerns, so prayers for our deceased loved ones are appropriate.

The feast day itself is rooted in the second century. In the 10th century, St. Odilo of Cluny established a memorial of all the faithful departed. Rome added the feast to the church's calendar in the 13th century. In many parts of the world the celebration of this feast day is marked with particular energy, such as el Dia del los Muertos in Mexico.

It's appropriate to commemorate All Souls Day by praying for those who have gone before us in faith. Some people also visit the graves of their loved ones to pray for them.

The feast of All Souls reminds us of our mortality. We are all finite, mortal creatures. We are all loved by God, who has endowed us with an immortal soul. Our ultimate destiny lies in God's hands, and even death does not separate us from his love.
