(from the Holy Gospel according to John 8:1-11)



## The Man Not Caught in Adultery

*The Woman Caught in Adultery* is the traditional title for today's gospel. The #MeToo movement might object. Why is the woman publicly shamed but her partner in sin is not? The Old Testament required the stoning of both, but the Pharisees held only the woman accountable. Yet Christ exposed their hypocrisy and tricked them into acknowledging their own sins.

The irony of this gospel is that the Pharisees, in accusing the woman of adultery, revealed their own sin of hypocrisy. When Christ bent down and wrote on the ground he may have been writing coded symbols of each accuser's own sins. Or he may have been tracing idly in disdain of their accusation to make them realize that



something greater was at issue. Either way, it worked. When Christ said, "Let the one who is without sin cast the first stone," they had to walk away in shame. The greater sin was the heartless humiliation of the woman by men who were guilty of many sins.

This gospel story revolves around two sins: the adultery of the woman and the hypocrisy of the Pharisees. Forgiveness of either sin required a contrite heart. The gospel suggests that the woman was repentant, while the Pharisees were not. They left; she stayed. The repentant woman was forgiven while the unrepentant Pharisees were not.

St. Augustine said of this story that at the end only two remained, misery and mercy. The woman and Christ: misery and mercy. This gospel story is about sin, but also about mercy, a mercy which moves a sinner to repentance.

Too often we remember only the clever words of Christ to the Pharisees "Let the one who is without sin cast the first stone." Yet Christ's challenging words to the woman are more significant: "Go, but do not sin anymore." Mercy without repentance is empty. The admonition once given to the woman, is now directed to every repentant Christian, "Go, but do not sin anymore."

The man who sinned with the woman was not held accountable, but the Pharisees were. Their sins were exposed. They brought a greater shame on themselves than on the woman. The man was not caught in adultery but the Pharisees were caught in their hypocrisy. Casting stones at others often reveals more about our own sinfulness than the wrong of the one we accuse.

These efforts are part of the ongoing work of the Church in the United States to carry out the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People.

Child abuse and neglect is a national issue that affects us all. The consequences of child abuse and neglect ripple across the lifespan, negatively impacting a child's chances to succeed in school, work, and relationships.

These statistics can seem overwhelming, but each one of us has the ability to make a difference in the lives of children. Working together, we can ensure that our Church offers an environment that is safe for all people.



**AWARENESS** is the first step in understanding our responsibilities as members of God's family, and usually gives rise to the question "What can I do?"

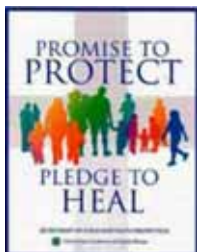
Talk with your children about the dangers of child abuse and steps that can be taken to prevent it within your own parish communities during this month of April.

The Diocese of Salina's safe environment program is designed for adults in our faith community—to raise their awareness about the nature of child sexual abuse, to educate them on how to recognize the warning signs, and to train them about what to do when they suspect a child is being victimized.

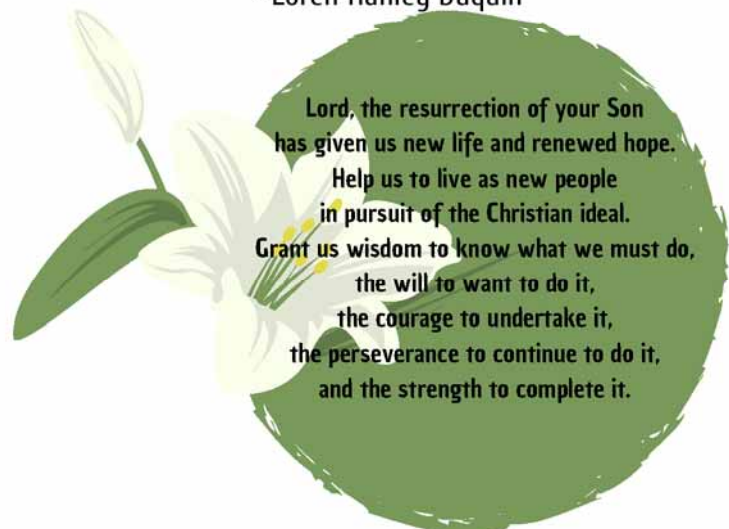
