### **History and Faith**

Today's gospel is a history lesson. In a subtle way. The reading from Luke situates John the Baptist's announcement of the coming of the Messiah in the historical context of that time. "In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Potius Pilate was governor of Judea..."

Why these arcane historical details? Because

Christianity is an historical That religion. cannot be emphasized too often. Most other world religions are based entirely on visions or apparitions. But Christianity is ultimately founded on the historical events of the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. He was born in Bethlehem, raised in Nazareth, preached throughout Judea, was crucified on Mount Calvary, and rose from the dead in Jerusalem. These events did not happen in someone's imagination or visions. They are real, verifiable historical events. Our faith is historical.

It is precisely as historical facts that Christianity holds a valid claim as truth. Some unbelievers have granted that Jesus of Nazareth was a wise moral philosopher but no more. But some modern atheists have seen the contradiction in that stance and so propose that Jesus of Nazareth was an imaginary figure, merely the personification of the ideals and dreams of the early Christians.

Why do they go to the extreme of denying the historical existence of Christ? Because once you acknowledge that Jesus of Nazarerth was a real historical person you are left with only two options: he truly was what he claimed to be, or he was a malicious liar. And few would try to defend that second option.

The historical reality of Jesus of Nazareth has further implications. Since Christ is the divine Son of God, as revealed especially throughout the gospel of John, then God has shared our nature and transformed it. Human life has taken on a new meaning, intimately related to divinity. We are not just rational animals, but truly brothers and sisters of the historical Jesus, children of God who is our Father. The incarnation has not only

changed history, but has transformed the meaning and value of

human life.

This eternal also has consequences. Through the incarnation we share by grace in the life of God, a life that cannot die. As we have a natural birthday, sons and daughters of our earthly parents, we also have that supernatural birthday, our baptism when we became children of God. During Advent we prepare to celebrate the historical fact of the birth of Christ which is the foundation of our hope not only for a more meaningful life here, but a life with God forever.

## Little Town of Bethlehem Viewing Ready at St. Boniface in Vincent


The "Little Town of Bethlehem" nativity at St. Boniface Catholic Church, Vincent will be open for visitors on Sundays December 8, 15, and 22, as well as Christmas Day. All times are 1:00-5:00 pm. Appointments can also be made at any other time by calling Carol at 785-735-9282.

This is the 98th year of the nativity, begun by the parish priest Fr. Callistus Rectenwald in 1927. Over the years, the nativity has become a worldwide representation of Christmas. Rocks from all 50 states and 105 countries surround the scene, in particular rocks from the Cave of Lourdes and the Sea of Galilee. Infant Jesus is from Spain, and Mary, Joseph, and the Three Kings are from Germany.

A special section of the nativity is dedicated to our veterans who could not be home for Christmas over the years, featuring rocks from Germany, Vietnam, Korea, Japan, Wake Island, and Christmas Island to name a few.


The nativity has had special lighting effects added the last few years - a color changing rock show and a neon blue-lit sky in the background. Four trickling waterfalls, animals and shepherds dot the scene surrounding the Bethlehem Inn, and the stable made from a nearby pear tree in 1927.

St. Boniface Catholic Church is located 5.5 miles south of Victoria and two miles east.



Victoria Community Coalition (VCC) is pleased to announce they have received **\$166,600** in Community Service Program (CSP) Tax Credits through the Kansas Department of Commerce. The available tax credits will be used to enhance fundraising efforts for **Phase I Apartments**.

Businesses and individuals subject to Kansas income tax are eligible to receive a tax credit through this program. Donors giving at least \$250 to **St, John's Place** redevelopment may qualify for a **70%** tax credit. For example, a donor making a \$1,000 gift receives a **\$700** tax credit when they file their state taxes, making the net cost to the donor only **\$300**.
