

#### **ASH WEDNESDAY—MARCH 5**

Lent is a time of grace and renewal for the entire Church, especially for the catechumens and candidates preparing for initiation during the Easter Triduum. The three traditional ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are important pillars for a faithful experience of Lent.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics (for those age 18 until age 59). In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from eating meat (for those age 14 and over). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

#### That Beam in Your Eye

Today's gospel offers one of the most challenging questions that Christ posed to his followers: "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye but not perceive the wooden beam in your own?"

The eye has one significant limitation. It cannot see itself. When we get a speck of dust in our eye we cannot see it. We need the help of a mirror or another person. As we cannot see that speck, we are blind to our own glaring faults, yet we see the petty faults of another, often magnified.

The gospel analogy offers three points for personal reflection: Our own faults are greater often than those of others: our personal failings distort our vision of others;

and we need help in seeing our own faults.

"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye but not perceive the wooden beam in your own." Too often we demand more of others than ourselves. Our greater fault, the beam, we overlook in ourselves; the lesser failing, the speck, is unacceptable in others.

Our own fault, that beam in our eye, also distorts our vision of others. A streak on your eyeglasses is imposed enlarged onto all that you see. Our own faults we project onto others, often magnified. Those who harbor grudges, find others unforgiving. Those who gossip resent others who carry tales. The miser complains that another is not generous.

As our eye cannot see itself, we are often blind to our faults and need help to see the flaws in our character. There are mirrors to help us find that beam in our eye: the scripture readings, a kind confessor or a trusted friend. We are grateful to the one who removes a particle from our eye. Yet when others kindly point out

> our mistakes we take offense, although they are relieving us of a source of pain.

When it is our duty as a parent, teacher or spouse to admonish another, we need to recall the delicate care required to remove a speck from another's eye. It must be done gently, with surgical

care, lest we do serious damage. Correcting the failings of others can do more harm than good; often revealing our own greater faults.

When we are troubled by the behavior of others, or when tensions arise in our relationships with others, especially those closest to us, we should prayerfully reflect on this challenging verse in today's gospel "Remove the wooden beam in your own eye first, that you may see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye."





#### Noah and the Flood

Near the beginning of the Bible, we hear a story about a great flood that covered the whole earth. Noah trusted God and built an ark for his family and many animals. The flood lasted 40 days and 40 nights. It prepared the Earth for God's people.

#### Moses in the Desert


After Noah and Abraham, God put a guy named Moses in charge of leading His people. God promised His people land filled with things they needed, but the people Moses sent to see it came back fearful. God's people lost their trust and ended up wandering around a desert for 40 years!

#### Jesus in the Desert

After his baptism, Jesus ended up in a desert for 40 days (40... just like Noah and Moses!) Satan tempted him in many ways, and Jesus did not have much food to eat or water to drink, but he knew this was his time to prepare for the hard things to come later in his life.

# **Lent Today!**

Like the 40 days of the flood, the 40 years Moses spent in the desert, and the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert, we have 40 days of **Lent** to train and prepare for what is coming next. During these 40 days before Easter, people try to give up certain things (fasting), give more to others (**almsgiving**), and strengthen their relationship with God (prayer). We call these things pillars of Lent.

ex: For my Family/Friends, Our Father before Bed, For Pope Francis & People who are Sick, For More Peace, Go to Adoration

ex: Hugging Friends More, Donating Money to People in Need, Helping Clean the House, Smiling at People More

#### fasting:

ex: From Candy, From Arguing with My Siblings, From TV, From Soda, From Complaining too Much


