

Love Your Enemy

The atheistic philosopher Fredrick Nietzche did not like Jesus of Nazareth. And today's gospel is one of the major reasons. Nietzche's basic theme was *The Will to Power.* He claimed that when Jesus taught his followers to love their enemies he encouraged them to be the miserable doormats of society, trampled on by their powerful oppressors.

The commandment of Christ to love our enemy is revolutionary. No other religion has anything remotely like it. Some even bless vengeance. But the gospel says, "Love your enemies and do good to those who hate you." That obviously goes against our natural instinct. So, why should we do good to those who hate us?



Today's gospel explains: "Then you will be children of God for He himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." If we love our enemies we do as God does. But why is God good and loving to the ungrateful? The Book of Wisdom says that kindness to the wicked "turns their hearts from destruction and their malice to mercy."

Here Christianity is surprisingly practical. Loving our enemies has the power to free our enemies from their hatred and vengeance. It is often the

only thing that can. Returning their hatred with hatred only escalates the war. Ignoring them entrenches a cold war. But when I love my enemies I not only lay down my own arms, I disarm my opponents. They no longer have an enemy. They can only fight with their own conscience.

The personal application of this gospel is not about politics or war. It is about our own interpersonal conflicts. A partner in marriage has been called the intimate enemy. When spouses have a falling-out any small issue can escalate dramatically, but a small act of love can disarm.

Children can also experience the intimate enemy when siblings fight among themselves. As do parents dealing with a rebellious teenager, or adult children estranged from their parents. A feuding neighbor can also be such an enemy. The right words to repair these rifts are difficult to find. But an act of kindness can break the ice of mistrust. When such enemies are in need of assistance, a helping hand can erase an old animosity. Love your enemy is the only effective way to defuse these situations.

Nietzche is not alone in promoting reliance on power to rule others. Many in modern society fail to realize that loving one's enemy, properly understood, is much more effective than the dominance of power to achieve what everyone desires most, peace.



Crosses will be removed on the Saturday after Easter, the morning of April 26.


The Knights will install crosses in the county as well as the City of Victoria.


