Water into Wine

There are no miracles in the gospel of John. The word miracle never appears in that gospel. John the Evangelist calls the wondrous deeds of Christ *signs*. Their importance is not the marvel, but the message. There are seven such *signs* which constitute the first part of that gospel, the Book of Signs; the second part is the Book of Glory which recounts the death and victorious resurrection of Christ.

These seven signs in the gospel of John are progressive, both in wonder and in the significance of their faith message. The first is today's gospel reading, the changing of water into wine at the wedding of Cana (2:1-11). The second is the healing of the royal official's son in Capernaum (4:46-54); followed by the healing of the paralytic at Bethesda (5:1-15); then the multiplication of the loaves to feed the five thousand (6:5-14); next Jesus walking on water (6:16-24); then the healing of the man blind from birth (9:1-7) and finally the climatic sign, raising Lazarus from the dead (11:1-45).

Today's gospel story of changing water into wine concludes with, "Jesus did this as the first of his signs in Cana of Galilee." While the wonder of providing the wine is not insignificant, the faith lesson is an important message: the generosity of God's grace, as the marvel of water becoming wine, can transform the ordinary into the extraordinary, the natural into the supernatural. By God's grace, the natural is given a supernatural meaning, which is the



essence of the sacraments. By the magnanimous grace of God the last become first, the poor are made rich, and the lost are found.

In John's gospel water was given a new meaning when Christ was baptized in the Jordan river. The blind man received sight from the water of the pool of Siloam, the Samaritan woman found faith when she drew water from Jacob's well, the Apostles learned unselfish service by the water

with which Christ washed their feet at the Last Supper. And the water with blood that came from the side of Christ on the cross was the ultimate

symbolic message of changing water into wine: we his faithful people became his church by the sacraments of baptism and Eucharist.

You are not expected to perform miracles. But you can change the ordinary into the extraordinary, the natural into the supernatural, by imitating the generosity of God. You can make the rejected feel accepted; the depressed, happy; and the lonely, welcome. You can change troubled waters into joyful wine.

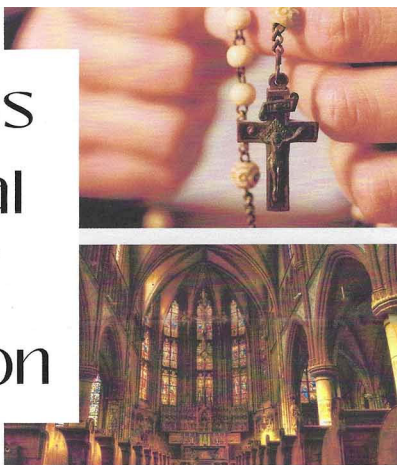

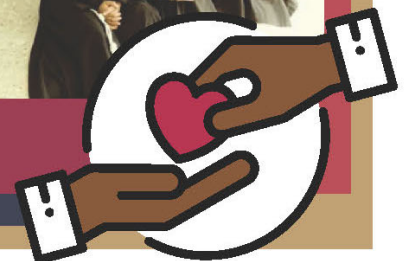
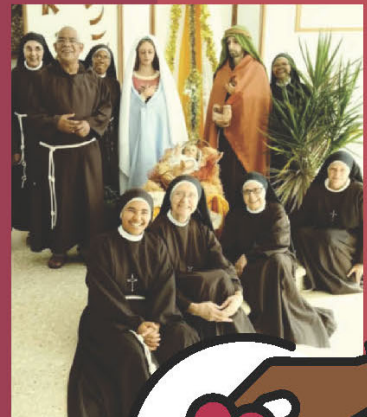
