

Faith Is Good Business

None of us wants an outsider telling us how to do our business. Whether you are a butcher, a baker, or a candlestick maker, you are proud of your skills and reluctant to heed advice from casual observers. So imagine the chagrin of St. Peter and the other disciples in this Sunday's gospel. They were professional fishermen and a wandering Rabbi, with a background in carpentry, told them how to fish. After they had carefully applied their skills all night long, this casual observer tells them, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." But all of life has a faith dimension. The gospel challenges us to integrate our faith into our daily work. There is more to your work than economic productivity and job security. There is an inherent dignity to your labors; your work involves moral responsibilities; and your profession is an expression of your faith. Such values present an enormous challenge in the modern world, especially in the complex areas of medicine, social service, and government.

It would be naïve to suggest that the Pope tell NASA when to launch or the pastor tell a computer techie how to program. Yet all of our work has a moral dimension: honesty in business, charity in service, respect for life, care for the unfortunate, mercy for failings, and example to youth. We need to reflect on these moral implications of our work with guidance from the Scriptures, from our Catholic tradition, and from the leaders of our faith.

However, the lesson of this gospel story is not how to fish, but how to practice of our faith. "Put out into deep water," is not about the water depth, but the deep parts of our minds and our hearts. "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

Most of us are skilled in a trade, a craft, a profession. We use our skills automatically without much reflection on the further implications of our work. In the urgency to do good work, it is easy to miss the faith dimension of our labor. In fact, we may deny it. "Keep religion out of politics." "The church cannot tell me how to run my business." "The Bible belongs in church." Above all we need the guidance of prayer where we listen to the voice of God's spirit deep within us. Prayer is one of the many ways that we follow the Lord's command to "Put out into deep water, and lower your nets for a catch."


In Need of Eucharistic Ministers

LIFT HIGH THE CROSS LENTEN YARD CROSS PROGRAM

The Knights of Columbus will be providing wooden crosses in the yards of people that would like to have one during the Lenten season.



At a cost of \$20, the Knights will install and remove the cross.

Crosses will be installed on Saturday morning, March 1, prior to Ash Wednesday. If you choose, you may decorate the cross with a ribbon or cloth,

but nothing that would permanently mark or damage the cross.

Crosses will be removed on the Saturday after Easter, the morning of April 26.

The Knights will install crosses in the county as well as the City of Victoria.




