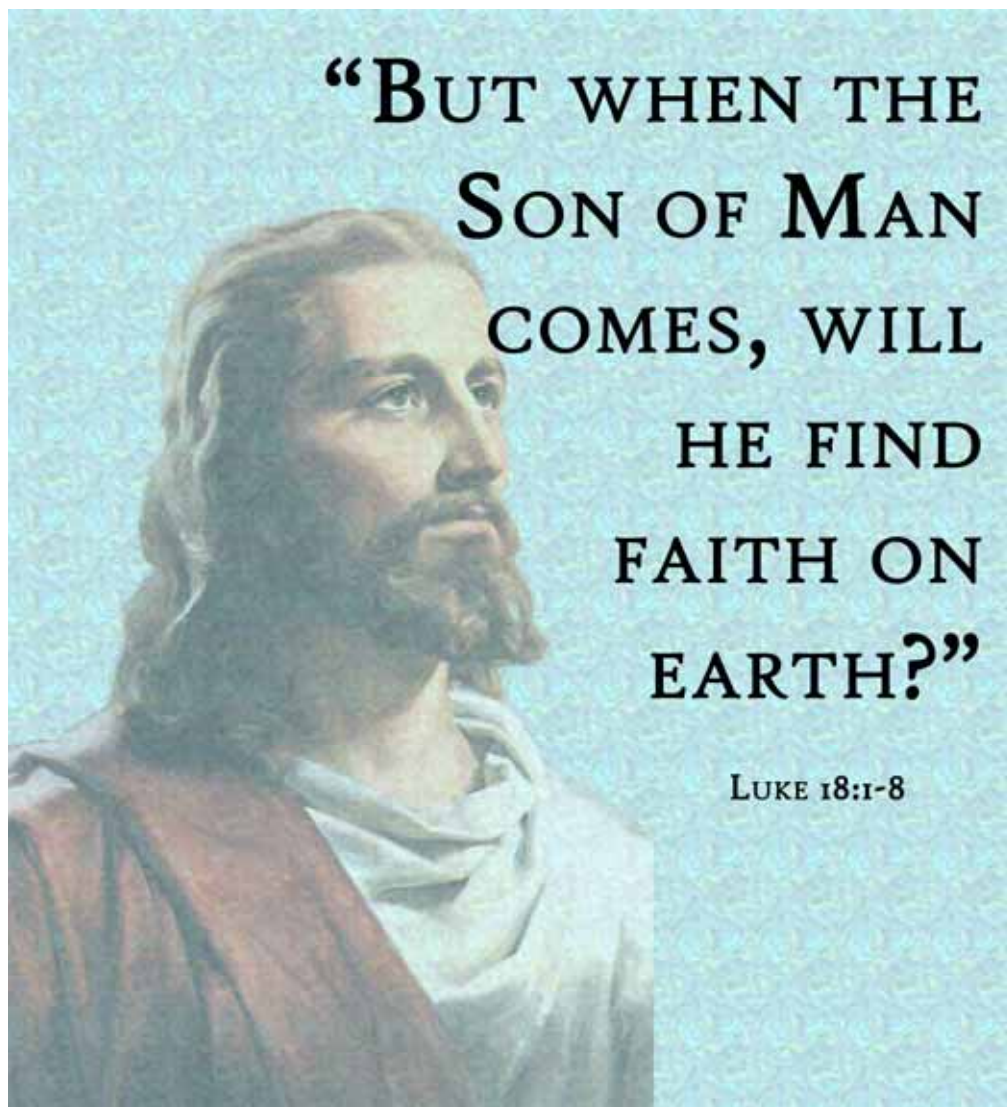

Holy Nagging

Gospel parables are to puzzle us and inspire a new perspective. This Sunday's story of the persistent widow and the dishonest judge has done just that to many, even scripture experts. We tend to assume that the judge represents God and the widow is a desperate Christian begging God for help. But a dishonest, heartless judge is not a fitting image of a merciful God.



Some sheep do not want to be found

Therefore some scholars have interpreted the parable with those roles reversed. The dishonest judge represents a reluctant Christian and the persistent widow represents God. Just as the widow hounded the judge until he granted her justice, God pursues the errant soul until repentance. That is the theme of Francis Thompson's classic poem, *The Hound of Heaven*.

*I fled Him down the nights and
down the days;
I fled him, down the arches of the
years
I fled him down the labyrinthine
ways
I hid in laughter and the mist of
tears.*

The sinner is fleeing from God who follows in pursuit. When the soul finally surrenders to God, the folly of his or her flight is explained, "*All things betray thee, who betrayest Me.*"

Today's parable, as *the Hound of Heaven*, is an image of how God pesters the reluctant to repent. Practicing Christians who attend church and try to follow the commandments might wonder just how they are fleeing God who is in pursuit. Despite our basic commitment and our regular observance, most of us have certain areas of our faith where we are fleeing from God.

We are all tempted to customize Christianity to suit ourselves, to pick and choose what is to our liking. We may, for example, follow faithfully the moral code of personal conduct but turn a deaf ear to social justice and civic charity. Or we may focus on tolerance and forgiveness but turn a blind eye to our own disregard of the commandments. And *the Hound of Heaven* will pursue us until we have accepted him fully.

We often rejoice that God is merciful and forgiving. We should not forget that God is also a demanding Lord and a nagging Father. Every parent knows the need for *holy nagging*. Children require a constant insistence to do what is right and proper. Our heavenly Father will nag his children until we respond fully to his grace. "Because this widow keeps bothering me, I shall deliver a just decision for her."
